#### **Phonics and Reading:**

Our new phonics and reading program in early childhood is now well and truly up and running in PP and Year 1. Our data is showing that our students are learning their sounds like never before. This is due to a very consistent and explicit approach. Well done to our staff and students! We will be offering a parent information session in Term 3 for parents to learn more about it and how they can further support their children at home.

#### Reviews:

All teachers have begun trialling daily Reviews in English and Maths. This allows students to revisit concepts and practice skills they have already learnt in order to move information from short term to long term memory. The Reviews are engaging and repeated over time until the content is mastered. Reviews are backed by brain research.

#### Reading to Your Child:

Are you reading to your child most days? We know that reading to children helps them develop important literacy skills, develops their vocabulary and gets them hooked on books. Even when children become independent readers, it is important to keep reading to them. Read to your children for as long as you can!


#### **Year Six Graduation Fundraiser**
