
Yangebup Primary School 22nd Sept 2023 Issue 15







PARENT CYBER SAFETY PRESENTATION

Thursday October 19 - 6:30pm to 8:00pm

Bibra Lake Primary School is proud to announce that after a 12 month wait, Paul Litherland, founder of Surf Online Safe and 2022 WA Australian of the Year, will be visiting Bibra Lake Primary School to conduct a cyber safety presentation for parents on October 19. Paul will also be speaking with our Year 5 & 6 students during the day regarding the risks of the internet and how they can protect themselves online.

Paul is widely considered one of Australia's leading educators in the field of Internet Awareness. As a former Western Australian Police Officer, he can offer some great knowledge and experience to help our parents better understand the risks our children are being exposed to in the online world.

The parent presentation commences at 6:30pm and concludes at 8:00pm, including a question-and-answer session. The subsidised cost for this session is \$10 per person. Paul will outline key points surrounding the online behaviours of our students and offer some good insight into where they are going online and the risks they are taking. All who have attended one of Paul's presentations have been impressed at how much they learn and amazed at how engaging he is as a speaker. We openly invite all parents to attend this important event.

Paul's parent presentations are very informative and offer some great tips and tricks on how to keep our kids safe online, as well as how to stay one step ahead of them in the online world. His information is not technical but offers truly useable solutions to help parents keep their kids safe on the internet.

Does your child want to play cricket this summer. If so, it is now time to register.


