### AusAlert

The Australian Government has asked schools to share information regarding their new national warning system that sends emergency messages to mobile devices called AusAlert. See more details in this newsletter, as well as a website for more information. Before AusAlert is ready to use in October 2026, local and national testing is needed so all Australians know what an AusAlert will look and sound like. A national test will be held on **Monday 27 July 2026 at 12 pm AWST**. All compatible mobile devices across Australia will receive a test alert on this day. As testing will occur during school hours, it is important that staff, students, parents and carers are aware of and prepared for the test.

## Understand AusAlert

AusAlert will send messages regarding emergency events to all Australians on their mobile devices, including:

- phones
- tablets
- smart watches
- safety watches
- vehicle devices.

AusAlert will behave differently to standard text messaging. It includes 2 alert levels, both featuring a unique siren ringtone and a message that appears on device screens.

### Critical alert

The critical alert is an intrusive alert that overrides silent and do not disturb settings. It is used only when there is an imminent threat to life and property. Users cannot opt out.

### Priority alert

The priority alert does not override silent and do not disturb settings. It is sent when advice is required on potential events. Users can opt out of this alert by accessing notifications in their device settings.

## What's been happening...

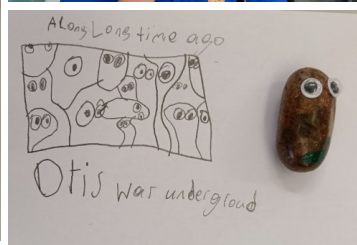
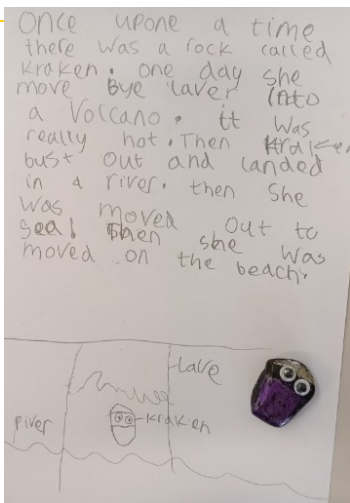


On Monday 25<sup>th</sup> May we had an incursion from AusEarthEd in our science lessons.

The years 6 students investigated the viscosities of different liquids to compare them to different lava types and consider which type of volcano they might come from. They will learn more this term about how viscosity can affect the shape and explosivity of volcanoes.

Room 12 used their senses to investigate their changing beads, which changed colour when UV shone on them. They became fantastic scientists making predictions and testing their hypothesis through investigations.

Room 1 learnt about the rock cycle through the exciting and scientifically factual story of a rock. They then got to decorate their own pet rocks and write the rocks story which they took home. This will help them with their understanding of weathering, erosion and deposition processes.






On Friday the 12<sup>th</sup> of June our Interschool team headed to Hammond Park Secondary College to compete at the annual Makuru Carnival. After a wet start to the day, the weather improved and the action began. We should be very proud of all 45 of our athletes as they competed brilliantly against five other local schools on the day. # Holidays and absences

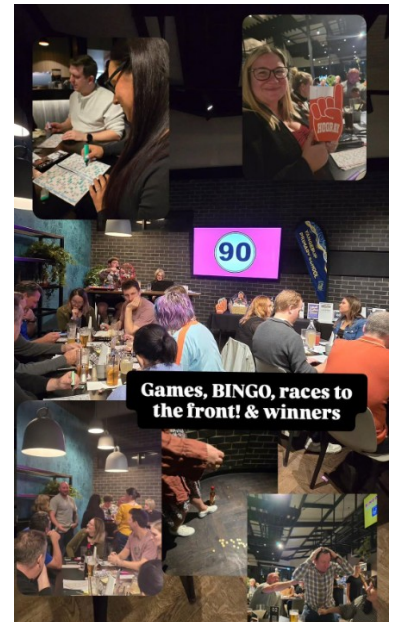

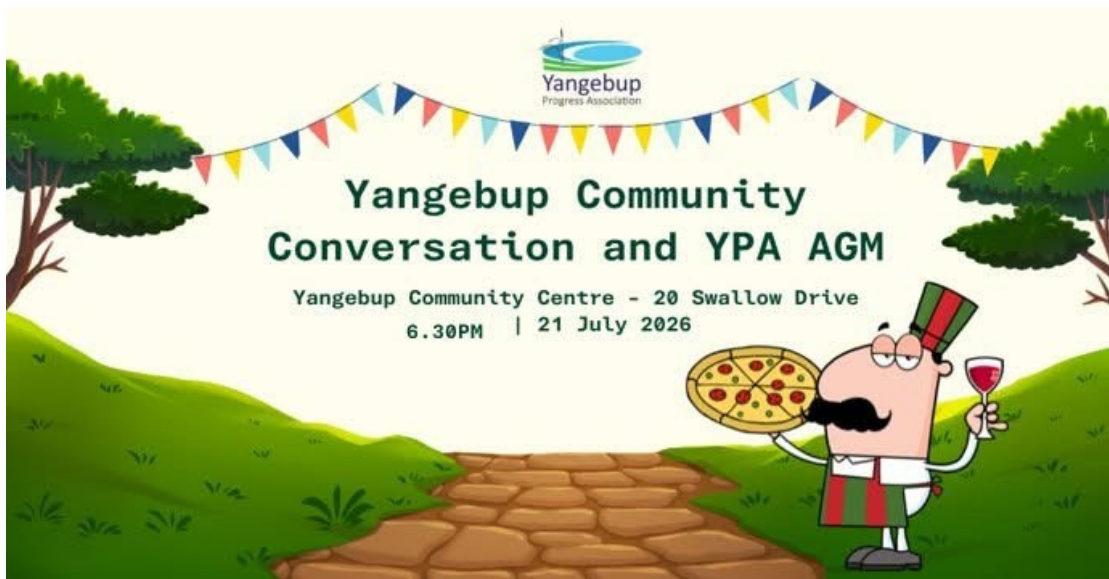
